POLICY POSITIONS



Championed legal protections to abortion after the Dobbs decision

- Supported Proposition 1 to California's state Constitution in 2022, which protected access to abortions and contraceptives; rated 100% by Planned Parenthood, which advocates for abortion access



Supports expanding the federal government's role in reversing climate change

- Believes the government should focus on the "more mundane" aspects of climate change policy, including "addressing methane leaks, decarbonizing more difficult sectors like heavy duty transit, aviation, or cement and asphalt production"; Chair of the state Senate Natural Resources and Water Committee and a member of the Environmental Caucus; introduced legislation restricting corporate carbon emissions and banning offshore drilling



Backed legislation limiting firearm access and stricter background checks

- Cosponsored SB 253, requiring companies to demonstrate their level of "climate risk"; supported legislation banning teachers' pensions from investing in oil drilling companies; authored the "first law in the country to enact the '30 by 30,'" which aims to protect 30% of open spaces in the country by 2030
